YCRC Proxy Form

When a voting member cannot attend a unit meeting in person, the member is entitled to send a proxy per YCRC Bylaws Article VII- Meetings, Section C-Proxy.

The holder of the proxy may have only one vote in any committee matter and must be someone, who is not already a voting member (because no person may cast more than one vote at a meeting). The proxy holder must be in accordance with the Republican principles and live within York County. All proxies shall be in writing, signed by the maker, and shall be substantial in the following form:
